General Rules

This Show conforms to the standards established by National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC) The Handbook for Flower Shows, revised 2017 – 2nd Edition, revised July 2020, July 2021, July 2022, July 2023, July 2024, July 2025. A digital version of the most up-to-date July 2025 revision is on the NGC website. The Handbook is the authority for all issues not covered by the Schedule, which is the Law of the Show.

1. Any member of National Garden Clubs, Inc. may enter this Show.
2. Entry Cards are available from The Garden Club of Greater Lansing from President Ann Schoals (517-281-1101 email aschoals@gmail.com) and Entry Cards will be available at all Meetings.
3. All exhibits in each division must be accompanied by an NGC Entry Card. Entry Cards are to be filled out completely with all required information in pencil or waterproof pen. Please see the sample Entry Card on page 7. Contact Entry Committee Chair for assistance in filling out Entry Cards.
4. The Horticulture Placement Committee will place all Horticulture Entries.
5. The Design Classification Chair must approve all design entries before the Exhibitor leaves the show floor.
6. All Entries except Photos must be received on Thursday, July 9 from 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm or Friday, July 10, 2026 between 8:00 am and 9:00 am. Photo Entries must be submitted to Sherry McCue, 1616 Park Avenue, Lansing, MI 48910 and must be received by Monday, July 6, 2026.
7. Invited Judges may place Exhibits between 8:00 am-9:00 am on Friday, July 10, 2026.
8. All Exhibits must be removed on Saturday, July 11, 2026, between 2:00 pm and 3:00 pm.
9. Photography Judging will be from 9:00 am to 10:00 am Friday, July 10, 2026 and all other Divisions will be 10:00 am to 12:00 pm
10. The Classification Chair for each division checks exhibit for conformity to the schedule prior to Judging. Final determination for conformance is the Judges' responsibility.
11. The General Chair and the Classification Chair for each division are available during judging for consultations. They, along with the Judges and Clerks, are the only personnel allowed on the floor during judging.
12. The decisions of the judges are final. Awards may be withheld if not merited.
13. There must be an emphasis on FRESH plant material. No artificial plant material is permitted in any Exhibit in any Division.
14. Each Exhibitor is limited to one entry per Class, except in the Horticulture Division. Exhibitors may make more than one entry per Class if each is a different species, variety, cultivar, type, or color.
15. The Garden Club of Greater Lansing will strive to assure the safety of all items after arrival and placement in the Show but is not responsible for any loss or damage to Exhibits.

- d. One (1) or more Honorable Mention (white) ribbons as merited; minimum score 75 points or more.

- 1. Award of Horticulture Excellence:** Rosette of green, orange and blue ribbons. Only one (1) is offered to the highest scoring 95+blue ribbon winner and correctly named Exhibit in the entire Horticulture Division.
- 2. Award of Merit:** Rosette of orange ribbons. Offered to the highest 95+ Exhibit. Four Award of Merits will be offered for all cut, non-woody specimens.

- 3. Garden Club of Greater Lansing Awards** (*Will be placed by Show Committee*)
Marilyn Lee Award (Local Award) for Section D. Marilyn Lee was member of GCGL 2005-2017 and an avid grower and promoter of Horticulture. The award is a Framed Picture and a rosette of yellow ribbons.
Edna Triphagen Award (District 2B Award) Sections C. Edna Triphagen was a Member of Intercity Garden Club and promoter of Agriculture. The award is a Silver Bowl and a rosette of yellow ribbons.

DIVISION II DESIGN

- 1. Award of Design Excellence:** A rosette of gold ribbons. Only one (1) offered for the highest scoring 95+ Exhibit in the Design Division.
- 2. Garden Club of Greater Lansing Awards** (*Will be placed by Show Committee*)
Jenny Bond Memorial Award (Local Award) for Class 4. Jenny Bond was a member of The Garden Club of Greater Lansing from 2009-2025, a National Garden Clubs Flower Show Judge, and a creative designer. The Garden Club of Greater Lansing Award is a Glass Flame Trophy and a rosette of yellow ribbons.

DIVISION III EDUCATION

Education Top Exhibitor Award: A brown and white rosette.
For the highest scoring 95+ Education Exhibit.

DIVISION IV BOTANICAL ARTS

Photography Award: A rosette of black and white ribbons. For the highest scoring 95+ photograph related to NGC goals and objectives.

Horticulture Division

DIVISION I “The Flora of Local Parks”

All Classes in Division I are eligible for: *Award of Horticulture Excellence (NGC)*

DIVISION I HORTICULTURE RULES

1. The NGC exhibit policies are printed in *Handbook for Flower Shows*, Chapter 6, Exhibiting in the Horticulture Division.
2. The rules for a single species cut or container-grown specimen are listed in the *Handbook for Flower Shows 2017-2nd Edition Revised July 2025*, Chapter 6, or its supplement *Horticulture Exhibiting and Judging*.
3. In order to receive an NGC Top Exhibitor Award, the Exhibitor must identify her/his entry by its binomial name or currently acceptable scientific designation.
(Consult *Handbook for Flower Shows 2017-2nd Edition Revised July 2025*, Exhibiting in the Horticulture Division, Chapter 6 page 137.)
4. Entry cards are to be filled out in advance if possible. Please print and use pencil or waterproof pen when filling out NGC Entry Cards. Fill out both the top and the perforated bottom portions. Pre-printed address labels are acceptable for Exhibitor’s name and address. (Refer to the Sample card on page 7 of this schedule.)
5. Entry tags are available from Garden Club President with additional tags available at the “Classification” table.
6. All entries must be checked into show by the Horticulture Classification Committee and placed by Placement Committee.
7. The Horticulture Classification Committee Chairman and General Show Chairman are free to subdivide classes by color, form, size, cultivar, variety or other distinguishing characteristics.
8. Cut specimens should not have foliage below the water line, except for *Gladiolus*.
9. If a plant is considered a flowering plant, it should be exhibited as a Flowering Specimen. Foliage plants may flower but should be exhibited as a Foliage Plant if they are grown for their leaves.
10. Specimens with a Class designation in the schedule may not be entered in “Any Other Worthy” Class.
11. All entries must be free of insects and disease. Specimens showing evidence of either will not be accepted.
12. Clear, colorless containers will be provided by the Committee for all cut specimens.
13. Wedging is permitted and provided by the Committee. (Clear plastic wrap)
14. Exhibit must have proper binomial name according to the schedule.
15. An award must be withheld if none of the exhibits designated in the schedule meet specific requirements.
16. All Horticulture Classes are open to any National Garden Clubs, Inc. member. All specimens must be fresh plant material grown by the Exhibitor. All Container Grown Plants must have been in the Exhibitor’s possession for **no fewer than 90 days**.

17. Oiling or shine treatment of foliage is NOT permitted.
18. An Exhibitor may make more than one entry per Class *only if* each exhibit is a different cultivar, type, or color.
19. All pots must be clean. Double potting is permitted in all Classes.
20. **All plant containers larger than 12” must be pre-registered** with Renee McMillen at (517) 706-9355 to ensure adequate display space.

Design Division

Division II Design – Visit a Local Park

Design Rules

1. The NGC exhibit policies are printed in *Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 7, Exhibiting in the Design Division*, NGC Policies and Guidelines.
2. Advance Registration with the Design Entries Consultant is required by June 24, 2026.
3. Plant material and non-plant material permitted and not permitted in the Design Division are printed in the *Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 7*.
4. All Classes are open to any National Garden Clubs, Inc. member who is an amateur arranger.
5. A 3"x5" card, neatly typed or printed naming the plant materials used must accompany each entry tag and may include explanation of design. Though binomial names are not required, they are encouraged for educational purposes.
6. Rules for Design Types, Advanced Design Types, Table Designs and Table Appointments are printed in the *Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 7*.
7. The Scale of Points for Design is listed in the *Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 14*.
8. An Exhibitor may enter as many Classes as desired. But only one exhibit per Class Designer is on his/her honor that the design being entered has not been previously entered or judged in an NGC Flower Show.
9. All design work must be the work of the Exhibitor. Plant material need not be grown by the Exhibitor.
10. There are four Entries for each Class.
11. **No** artificial flowers, fruit, or foliage is allowed. Fresh plant material must **never** be treated
12. Some plant material must be used in every design.
13. Religious symbols used must be displayed in a respectful manner.
14. All living members of the Animal Kingdom, e.g. mammals, birds, fish, etc., and taxidermal representation of the same, are not permitted in a Standard Flower Show.
15. Landscapes or scenes are not permitted in the Design Division.

- Staged on a section of table 36" wide by 24" deep, 28" from floor draped in black against a background of dark forest green with undertones of black.

- Underlay permitted. Designer may use background

Educational Division

Division III Educational Exhibits – Giving Back

General Rules

1. Education Exhibits may be the work of more than one individual or organization unless a Student Judge or an Accredited Judge is seeking exhibiting credit for preparing an education exhibit.
2. An exhibit must occupy a minimum of eighteen (18) square feet surface area.
3. Plant material is NOT required but NCG encourages the use of some fresh plant material in Educational Exhibits.
4. Advanced Registration with the Education Entries Chairman is required by April 10, 2026.
5. The Scale of Points for Education Exhibits is listed in *Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 14*.
6. Educational Top Exhibitor Award, is given for an Educational Exhibit designed to instruct the public in some phase of National Garden Clubs, Inc. objectives and must score 95 or above
7. Staged on a 6-foot table skirted in black, topped in white

Botanical Arts Rules

1. The Scale of Points for judging Botanical Arts Horticulture, Design, Artistic Crafts and Photography are listed in Chapter 14 of the *Handbook for Flower Shows*.
2. The Rules of Photography are printed in the *Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 10*
3. Schedule determines type of photography, exhibit and staging,
4. There are six (6) entries per class.
5. Professional printing is permitted.
6. Photo may be enhanced by the exhibitor with cropping, filters, adjustments and/or darkroom techniques. Images with extreme manipulation may be displayed in all classes.
7. Photos may be exhibited in either portrait or landscape mode.
8. Exhibitor must preregister with the designated consultant for each class entered.
9. If you are entering horticulture and/or design in this show, your entry photograph(s) must be entered in the show at the same time. Be sure to write your entry number on the entry tag for your photo.
10. Photos are to be entered without mats or frames. The staging committee will provide black mats and hang the entries on a white background.
11. Please complete entry cards in advance, if possible. Consultants will have entry cards available for your use.
12. All photographs must measure 8" x 10" and contain some horticulture. They may be printed in portrait or landscape mode.
13. You are encouraged to submit a 3" x 5" card with each entry identifying plant material (botanical names preferred). Information about your photo may also be included.
14. Photo Entries must be submitted to Sherry McCue, 1616 Park Avenue, Lansing, MI 48910 and must be received by **Monday, July 6, 2026**.
